Assignment #1

Choose **TWO** of the prompts provided and write a one- page response to each. Your response should be typed in MLA format and will be uploaded to Turnitin during the first week of school.

- 1. Describe the similarities and differences of Judaism, Islam and Christianity.
- 2. Describe the differences between centralized and decentralized civilizations and give an example of each.
- 3. Analyze at least THREE causes for the decline of Classical civilizations.
- 4. Explain how trade networks caused Islam and Buddhism to spread.
- 5. Identify a continuity that kept southern India unified despite disruptions after the fall of the Gupta Empire.
- 6. Identify and explain one new historical development after 600 C.E.
